GENERAL ORDER TERMINATING STAY IN CIVIL CASES

Before the Court is the matter of the lapse in appropriations for the Department of Justice and the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Oklahoma, previously addressed in General Order 13-4.

1. On October 1, 2013, the Court entered General Order 13-4, which stayed all civil cases within the Western District of Oklahoma wherein the United States or an agency, corporation, officer or employee, deemed or otherwise, of the United States is a party during the lapse of appropriations to the Department of Justice.

2. Pursuant to Paragraph 9 of General Order 13-4, the Court stated that it would enter additional instructions and guidance upon notice from the United States Attorney that Congress restored appropriations to the Department of Justice.

3. By letter dated October 17, 2013, the United States Attorney has notified the Court that Congress has restored appropriations to the Department of Justice.


4. As appropriations are now restored, the stay entered by General Order 13-4 is terminated as of this date and additional guidance is hereby provided.

5. All deadlines in civil cases within the Western District of Oklahoma wherein the United States or an agency, corporation, officer or employee, deemed or otherwise, of the

United States is a party shall be extended as follows: (i) all deadlines, response dates, due dates or cut-off dates that fell during the period of the stay shall be extended for 16 days from the date of this order; and (ii) all other previously ordered deadlines, response dates, due dates or cut-off dates falling after the date of this order shall be extended for 16 days from the current deadline, response date, due date or cut-off date or as otherwise provided by the Court.

6. All civil hearings involving the United States or an agency, corporation, officer or employee, deemed or otherwise, of the United States that were to occur during the stay shall be reset on a case-by-case basis.
