This year's Lecture will focus on the **legacy, impact, and scholarship** of Judge William J. Holloway, Jr.

Judge McKay obtained his undergraduate degree from Brigham Young University and his law degree (Order of the Coif) from the University of Chicago in 1960. After law school, Judge McKay served as a judicial law clerk, practiced law, and served as a law professor. In addition, he has served as Director of the Peace Corps in Malawi, Africa. Since 1977, he has served as a Judge on the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals.
