

ORDER

Upon motion, the presiding judge may authorize in-custody defendants to have access to electronically stored discovery without counsel being present. Such access shall be provided as follows:

- 1. Access shall be via laptop computers provided by the court, which will be stored and secured at the facilities used by the United States Marshal Service to house detainees in this District.
- 2. The computers shall be programmed so they allow only read-only review of discovery material that has been downloaded onto an encrypted flash drive. Discovery material provided by the government and not subject to specific objection will be downloaded by defense counsel onto the encrypted flash drive.
- 3. Programs will be installed on the computers to ensure that copying, altering, or adding to the discovery is not permitted. In addition, Wi-Fi, network, and Bluetooth communications shall be disabled.
- 4. Requests to review discovery will be made by the defendant to the facility housing him or her. The facility shall maintain the laptops and flash drives in a secure location.
- 5. A defendant shall have up to six hours of access to the discovery per week and shall be provided a private and secure location at the facility in which to review the discovery. The amount of access time per week may be increased by the presiding judge based on the needs of a particular case.

6. Defendants shall not be permitted to take notes regarding the discovery, and at the conclusion of each review session, the computer must be turned off, which will automatically delete all discovery viewed so no documents will remain on the computer.
